

Information for people coming from Ukraine

If you who have a biometric passport, you can be in Sweden for up to 90 days without applying for a residence permit from the Swedish Migration Agency. This applies on condition that you can support yourself financially during that period and that you have somewhere to live.

Protection under the Temporary Protection Directive

If you have fled the war in Ukraine, you can apply for a residence permit under the EU Temporary Protection Directive. The permit provides you with temporary protection in Sweden and the right to work. You also have the right to medical care and children have the right to go to school. You can get help with accommodation and financial support from the Swedish Migration Agency.

You can apply for a residence permit for you and your family by using the e-service on the Swedish Migration Agency's website or by going to a Swedish Migration Agency office in person. If you apply through the e-service and have arranged your accommodation yourself, you do not need to visit the Swedish Migration Agency until after you have received a decision.

Do you need help with accommodation?

If you need help with accommodation, you must go to a Swedish Migration Agency office in person.
